BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY BY DISTANCE

The B.Th. by Distance enables students to study in their own communities, and reduces the on-site residency requirement to eight months. We trust that this will make courses and training for ministry in Christ's name ever more accessible. Students who are sponsored by their denomination for ministerial training (whether as ordained or as lay) may enroll.

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY FOR DISCIPLESHIP AND MINISTRY

This innovative six-year Bachelor of Theology degree does not assume previous university experience and is delivered over three terms every year. Students study in their home communities as part of a Local Education Group formed with a facilitator. Students are free to complete either two, four, or six years of the program and depending upon how far they decide to do will be eligible to receive a certificate, a diploma or a degree.

DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY

A weekend program designed for persons interested in learning more about Scripture, Christian belief, personal spiritual development and ministry. This program is designed to engage both heart and mind in the context of classroom interaction, community, and prayer. Participants attend classes Friday evenings (7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.) and Saturdays (9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) during the academic year. Format includes input and discussion. No exams or assignments. All work is completed in the class setting. Upon completion of years A, B, & C students are awarded the Diploma in Theology and Ministry.

ASSOCIATE IN THEOLOGY (2 credit hour courses)

The Associate in Theology program is a course of study designed for persons who are interested in increasing their knowledge and appreciation of Christian belief and practice. As well as developing their pastoral skills, this program also provides a theological base for persons assuming leadership and ministry within the life of their faith community. Enrollment in this program does not require any previous work in theological studies.
