**Master of Theology Degree.** In 2015, Queen's introduced a Master in Theology (M.Th.) Degree. This degree is designed and intended for those candidates who hold the degree of Bachelor of Theology (B.Th.) or equivalent.

The M.Th. program requires the equivalent of one year of full-time study, involving ten three-credit-hour courses. It may be taken on a full-time or part-time basis. Applicants can request advance standing for three courses completed in their Bachelor of Theology Program. This a great opportunity for individuals holding a degree in theology to focus their continuing education and advance their credentials.

### **Tuition and Fees at Queen's College**

Many of you have been monitoring the media coverage regarding budget and tuition issues at MUN and asking about tuition and fee rates at Queen's College. The Corporation of Queen's College discussed this matter at our May 04, 2017 Corporation Meeting. Corporation decided to continue the practice of following MUN tuition and fee rates. We are on MUN campus, in a MUN-owned building, using the University infrastructure and services, and incurring similar financial and budget challenges. We will adjust our fees as follows:

- Tuition rates are unchanged for any courses and students.
- Student services fee of \$50.00 per term for all part time and full-time students in all programs.
- Campus renewal fee of \$50.00 per credit course. This includes all Associate, Bachelors and Masters programs. It does not apply to the Diploma program, which is a non-credit program.
- The fees will be implemented for September 2017.

### **Queen's College Archivist.**

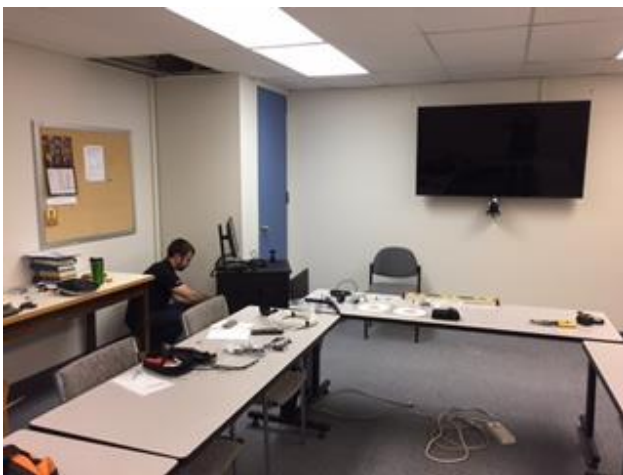

## BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY BY DISTANCE

The B.Th. by Distance enables students to study in their own communities, and reduces the on-site residency requirement to eight months. We trust that this will make courses and training for ministry in Christ's name ever more accessible. Students who are sponsored by their denomination for ministerial training (whether as ordained or as lay) may enroll.

Phase I: Associate Courses (fifteen two credit hour courses)    Phase II: St. John's Residency; Phase III: Intensive Courses & Internship

## BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY FOR DISCIPLESHIP AND MINISTRY

This innovative six-year Bachelor of Theology degree does not assume previous university experience and is delivered over three terms every year. Students study in their home areas as part of a Local Education Group formed with a facilitator. Students are free to complete either two, four, or six years of the program and depending upon how far they decide to do will be eligible to receive a certificate, a diploma or a degree.

## DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY

A weekend program designed for persons interested in learning more about Scripture, Christian belief, personal spiritual development and ministry. This program is designed to engage both heart and mind in the context of classroom interaction, community, and prayer. Participants attend classes Friday evenings (7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.) and Saturdays (9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) during the academic year. Format includes input and discussion. No exams or assignments. All work is completed in the class setting. Upon completion of years A, B, & C students are awarded the Diploma in Theology and Ministry. The Roman Catholic program is offered in a two-year format

## ASSOCIATE IN THEOLOGY

*(2-credit hour courses)*

The Associate in Theology program is a course of study designed for persons who are interested in increasing their knowledge and appreciation of Christian belief and practice. As well as developing their pastoral skills, this program also provides a theological base for persons assuming leadership and ministry within the life of their faith community. Enrollment in this program does not require any previous work in theological studies.
