Message from the Provost

We are well underway with preparations for Academic Year 2019 - 2020, it is Queen's College 179th year. We have so much for which to be thankful: the courageous founders, the generous benefactors, the dedicated leaders and faculty members, the trusting and enthusiastic students, the valiant alumni, legal partners, and the ever present spirit of renewal. We are also thankful to have our lease agreement in place with MUN for the next 30 years.

We have a great selection of programs and course available on-campus and on-line. We have part-time and full-time students in our Masters, Bachelors, Diploma and Associate programs who are preparing for ordained and lay leadership roles in eight denominations. This year we will offer our Diploma in Theology and Ministry at Gander, Deer Lake, Labrador, Marystow, and we will have two groups in St. John's. Also, we will offer an intensive course on presiding at the Eucharist in Western Diocese. Our Discipleship and Ministry Program in the Anglican Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf continues to evolve and grow.

This year we will be doing substantial work on our accreditation with Association of Theological Schools (ATS). I have recently been selected as an Accreditation Surveyor with ATS. While this will be a bit of extra volunteer work for me, it reflects regard for initiatives of Queen's College and our credibility within ATS. I am hoping the experience as a surveyor will be a resource for our own accreditation preparations. I should note that Queen's is the second largest Canadian Anglican College in ATS. Only Wycliffe has a higher enrolment.

Lease Agreement

Queen's College Faculty of Theology and Memorial University of Newfoundland have a unique and positive relationship. On June 18, 2019, representatives of MUN and Queen's College gathered to complete and mark the renewal of the longstanding affiliation between Newfoundland and



Labrador's two degree granting educational institutions. We gathered in the Chapel with Mid-day

prayer, followed by comments from representatives of MUN and Queen's, signing of the document to acknowledge the affiliation, and lunch in the Common Room.

Dr. Kent Decker, MUN Vice President for Administration and Finance and Ms. Ann Browne, Associate Vice President for Facilities both spoke of the Universities regard for the mission of Queen's College and the importance of a positive relationship for the future, as it has been in the past. They both acknowledged the good natured spirit of negotiations and tenacious current Provost, Dr. Rick Singleton. The original lease agreement with MUN was put in place 25 years ago. Rev. Dr. Canon Frank Cluett, Provost of Queen's at the time, gave a succinct and informative history of Queen's and the relationship with MUN. He acknowledged the cooperation and support at the time especially from Dr. Leslie Harris, Dr. Art May, and Dr. Boyd Morgan. The gathering was blessed to have members from 1994 Queen's College Corporation present for the gathering: Canon Carl Major and Mr. Fred Vivian. Fred's daughter, Lynn Vivian-Book is currently a member of the Corporation of Queen's College. The Provost expressed thanks to those who attended and especially to the MUN team for their support and cooperation in the

negotiations. The Provost highlighted the support and advice of Canon Cluett, Fr. Boyd Morgan and Mr. Brad Wicks throughout the process.

New Role: Rev. Derrick Bishop has agreed to take on the part-time role as Coordinator of Outreach Programs with Queen's College Faculty of Theology for the next year (August 01, 2019 to July 31, 2020). This position is primarily a coordinating role for four areas: Associate in Theology, Discipleship and Ministry, Pastoral Care Volunteer Training, and Association of Theological Schools Accreditation. The position reports to the Provost and Faculty Council. Derrick's experience and enthusiasm will be an asset to the College, our students and our faculty members.

Diploma in Missional Leadership is a five-course program introduced in 2019 to equip individuals to be leaders in the missional activities of the Church in the 21st century. This year, we are fortunate to collaborate with the diocese of eastern Newfoundland and Labrador in building a course around the conference sponsored for clergy and missional teams in that diocese.

Those interested in pursuing the Diploma can do the five select courses for credit toward a bachelor or Master Degree or they can do the courses as audit (no written work for evaluation and half the tuition of a regular course)

Discernment for Missional Leadership (3571-Q):

Explorations in personal and communal discernment and spiritual resilience for those called to inspire others with a missional vision and to facilitate missional transformation within faith communities. This course has three components

1. Missional Imagination
2. Spiritual Entrepreneurship
3. Contemplative Leadership.

Missional Imagination. September 26th and 27th

Presenters: Alan Roxburg and Jay Koyle. This component is building on the Missional Conference offered by the Diocese of Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador. Participants are expected to attend all the conference sessions in person.

Spiritual Entrepreneurship. October 25th.

Presenter: Bishop John Watton. This session will bring participants to a deeper level of discovery, discernment and excitement about missional activity. This session will be available on-site at Queen's and by webinar.

Contemplative Leadership. November 22nd.

Presenter: Canon Gerald Westcott. This session will bring us to a focus, both literally and figuratively, on the place of listening and contemplation as engagement with God and essential for the spiritual resilience of missional leaders. This session will be available on-site at Queen's and by webinar.
