Students from six denominations are enrolled as part-time and full-time students in both degree and non-degree programs. Courses and programs are available on campus, on line and by correspondence. Queen's College is incorporated under an Act of the Provincial Legislature which grants it authority to confer degrees in theology. Queen's College is an Associate Member of the Association of Theological Schools of the United States and Canada.

We are seeking a person who is able to contribute to our community by lecturing in one or more areas of study as well as serving as the Director of Outreach Programs. This person will take a leadership role in faculty and be expected to teach a full-time load.

As the Director of Outreach Programs, you will be expected to take the lead in the following areas:

- Seeking innovations in Digital Outreach, including in ministry settings and in the provision of distance theological education
- o Coordinating the Associate Program
- o Expanding the College's Community Outreach
- Coordinating Student placements and field education

Our ideal candidate will have a proven track record in teaching and a terminal degree (or be actively engaged in obtaining such a degree), appropriate to your field of study. As we are a small college, the ability to teach in more than one area would be an asset. It is expected that you will have experience in congregational leadership and be familiar with the cultural diversity of Newfoundland and Labrador.
