#### Queen's College: Equipping People to Serve for 180 years



I love the entrance to our College. As soon as you open the door you see a long corridor covered in beautiful wooden panels – our “boards” (as I like to call them). On them are listed the names of our students going right back to 1841. Sometimes I think of them as “story boards”; each name a story of someone wrestling with their vocation and equipping themselves with the skills needed to say “yes”.
