We have some great courses lined up for the Fall with some new professors as well. We are continuing to look for new ways to meet the needs of our faith communities.

Convocation Eucharist for graduates, family and students took place on May 11th at St Augustine's Church. Our chaplain, Father John was the officiant and our homilist was Dr Carmel who wove together the four scripture readings chosen by the Planning

Committee and how each speaks to our



responsibility to live the Good News using the tools students have learned over the past three years. As always, there was a time for fellowship.

The Alumni Association Workshop took place May 12th at St Augustine's Church Hall, St. John's. The morning began with a welcome from the Rev Canon Dr Frank Cluett, the chair of the Alumni Association and the Rev Rudolph Anthony, Rector of the Parish. The College Chaplain, Father John led morning devotions from the Iona Community and included a 'Litany for the Healing and Restoration of our Church' (Diocese of Rupert's Land 2017). Following a presentation on behalf of the College to

our retiring chaplain the Provost introduced our guest, the Rt Rev Riscylla Shaw, area Bishop of the Diocese of Toronto.



Bishop Riscylla led a Bible Based Discipleship reflection from John 13:16-20 which provided three opportunities to hear different versions of scripture, each followed by sharing from the community answering the questions: 'What words spoke to you? What did we hear Jesus say? and What is Jesus asking us

to do?'. Acknowledging the diveristy of our backgrounds, the Bishop then led a land acknowledgement naming some of the Indigenous people represented by all those at the workshop.

Bishop Riscylla circulated a card to each person on the 'The Seven Grandfather Teachings' and explained how we can learn from this traditional Aboriginal Teaching:

- To cherish knowledge is to know wisdom;
- To know love is to know peace;
- To honour all of creation is to have **respect**;
- Bravery is to face the foe with integrity;
- **Honesty** in facing a situation is to be brave:
- **Humility** is to know yourself as a sacred part of creation:
- Truth is to know all of these things.



Bishop Riscylla concluded her presentation by sharing stories by 1st Nation Peoples and on her current work on reconciliation on behalf of the Anglican Church of Canada. This was an excellent

opportunity to learn more of our Aboriginal heritage and the ongoing work of our church.

The Annual General Meeting of the Alumni took place after lunch with the election of officers for 2022: President: The Rev Paulette Budgen, Vice-President: The Rev Debbie Pantin, Secretary: The Rev Terrance Coates, Treasurer: The Rev Gerri Poirier and Members at Large: The Rev Margaret Hall, The Rev Dr Canon Frank Cluett, The Venerable Dr Tom Moulton, The Rev Jeffrey Blackwood and Mr Eric White.

The Alumni has established a Scholarship with a capital of \$125,000 under the Queen's College Bursary and Trust Funds and will renew an appeal to grow the principle.

Convocation 2022

What joy to gather as the Queen's College Community at Convocation 2022 with most of the COVID-19 restrictions lifted. Listening to the chatter before and again after convocation was heartwarming and a strong sign of how much we have been missing each other.



Convocation 2022 began with the arrival of Her Honour, the Honourable Judy Foote, Lieutenant Governor of Newfoundland and Labrador. Following the National

Anthems of Canada and the Ukraine and a reading of the Land Acknowledgement, Bishop Sam led the gathering prayers. Her Honour congratulated the graduates and spoke of the 'Heart Garden' on the grounds of Government House which recognizes the aboriginal children who have died. Dr Margaret Steele brought greetings from Memorial University and wished our graduates well in the futrure.

Dr Joanne gave her report to Convocation, referring to our past history and the new vision of the college through the years as it meets the needs of our time. The new Vision of the College now reads: "Queen's College is an accepting, responsive, affirming, pioneering, empowering community of theological learning and spiritual formation sending forth disciples to help transform society through God's redeeming love."

Bishop Riscylla addressed convocation on the ongoing work of reconciliation and our role in healing relationships with each other and creation and our role in making it a reality.



Dr Carmel Doyle read her citation for the awarding of the degree of Divinity (Honoris Causa) to Dr Janice Fitzgerald. Her citation spoke of Dr Fitzgerald and her team in their commitment to health care in our province and our need to 'Hold Fast'. The citation concluded with a video

from all parts of our province who contributed pictures saying 'Thank you' to Dr Fitzgerald. The appreciation of convocation was shown by the sustaining applause given to Dr Fitzgerald.

Bishop John Organ lead the closing prayer and Convocation adjourned with the singing of the "Ode to Newfoundland", the obligatory photographs and a wonderful reception.
