Convocation 2020 will be one that will go down in



our books for sure. From the first wave of the COVID-19 pandemic, through numerous pauses and lots of planning, adjusting and revising, the College was ready to proceed, albeit with a scaled back version at the Jack Byrne Arena. Two

days before Convocation, a new decision was made to go 'virtual' with only a small social distancing gathering at the College itself.

The Provost, Dr Rick Singleton, as Vice-Chancellor



assumed the role of Chancellor as per the College Constitution. After some words of explanation, he declared Convocation open. Bishop John

Organ of the Diocese of Western Newfoundland led the Gathering Prayer. It was a great pleasure to have the Lieutenant Governor, the Honourable Judy Foote bring Greetings, followed by the Honourable Tom Osborne, Minister of Education, and Dr Vianne Timmons, President, Memorial University who each also brought greetings. The Provost gave his annual report mentioning the challenging year it has been with a delay in opening due to last minute refurbishment, to 'snowmageddon' and then 'COVID-19'. He highlighted how we have continued to deliver programs and initiatives through it all. The Rev Canon Dr Frank Cluett delivered the



Convocation address, briefly reflecting upon the 179 year history of the College and his time as Provost before speaking directly to the graduates... "So I wish you well and God's blessing in your ministry in whatever role you exercise it.

And I pray that you will take your learning, your skills to make a living and your skills in how to live into the public square and empowered by your vision seek to build a better world. For I believe now that the goal of our faith is not simply to enable persons after death to escape hell and get to heaven, it is certainly to help people not to create hell on earth but to make the world a better place for all, leaving our eternal destiny in the hand of a loving creator. Ours is a daunting task. Don't expect to change the work overnight! That's impossible. My advice is to have a global vision but you minister in a local context."

The awarding of honorary degrees commenced with
