Convocation Eucharist took place at the Church



of St Thomas' St. John's on Wednesday, October 20th. St Thomas' was chosen in recognition of the 180th anniversary of the first Queen's College students who began their training in that exact same church. The Chancellor, the

Rt Rev John Watton was our presider and former

provost, Dr Rick Singleton was our homilist. He spoke briefly on our faith journey acknowledging the 'Kingship of God, the Activity of God, our Intimacy with God, and our Connectedness to the Body of God. We have a place with God, and it is up to us to



make the presence of Christ real in our world.'

Students from our programs shared in scripture readings and leading of intercessions. Thank you to the Rev Debbie Pantin, Tracey Sullivan and Mary-Anne Stevens who with the chaplain planned the liturgy, which was attended by about 45 students,

faculty, families and friends. A special thank-you to the Rev Gail MacDonald and the parishioners of St Thomas for providing us the opportunity to celebrate this milestone in our college life.



**Convocation 2021** What a joy it was to have Convocation 2021 as an inperson and live streamed gathering in the Church of St Mary the Virgin, St. John's on October 21<sup>st</sup>. Following the arrival of her honour, The Honourable Judy M Foote, Lieutenant Governor of

Newfoundland and Labrador, the Chancellor the Rt Rev John Watton declared Convocation open and then read the Land Acknowledgement. Opening Prayer was led by the Rt Rev John Organ, Bishop of the Diocese of Western Newfoundland. Greetings were brought by the Lieutenant Governor, Her Honour Judy M Foote, the Honourable Tom Osbourne, MHA and Dr Sean Cadigan, Associate Vice-President (Academic), Memorial University.

Following the Affirmation in the Office of Provost, the Rev Dr Joanne Mercer gave her inaugural Report to Convocation. The highlights are found in her 'Greetings and Thanks from the Provost'.



The Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, the



Most Rev Linda Nicholls delivered her address. She spoke of 'Milestones in Life' and how this day will be remembered by the Graduates and Families as a continuation of Baptismal Ministry. The Primate offered three 'Words

of Counsel', not as an expert but as a fellow traveler, a pilgrim: 1) You are a child of God first, nurture your faith; 2) Never stop being curious in learning, there are new areas of exploration and new ideas; and 3) Nurture good friends who help keep us humble and grounded. The Primate concluded by asking all to listen to the voice of God within us which leads us closer to our life in Christ.

Mr Dennis Budgell read his citation for the awarding of the degree of Doctor of Divinity (Honorius Causa) to the Rev Jim Reid. He gave a wonderful picture of 'Rev Jim' from his early days in Codroy and his ministry throughout the province, recognizing his

20+ years in Gander. Rev Jim's son Douglas and daughter Kathryn were his attendees. The Chancellor then admitted Dr Jim and the Convocation showed their congratulations to him with a hearty applause.



The College Chaplain, Father John Courage announced the names of candidates in their respective programs. Each Graduate's academic hood was placed by an attendee and Dr Carmel Doyle, Director of Student Programs handed each their certificate or diploma.

Closing prayer was led by the Ven Charlene Taylor. Convocation 2021 adjourned with Bishop John Watton leading in prayer, and expressed thanks to all who made this day a memorable one and declaring Convocation closed.

### Cyprus and the Gulf Convocation 2021

A degree Convocation was held at St Paul's Cathedral Nicosia on October 26th to admit four Queen's graduates to the BTh in Discipleship and Ministry. This is the second graduation ceremony to have been held in Cyprus as a result of the special link between Queen's and the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf. On this occasion the three graduands present were all from Cyprus, but the Diocese covers ten political jurisdictions including most of the Middle East. On the last occasion in 2018, Dr Rick Singleton was present to represent Queen's. On this occasion Rev Dr John Holdsworth, a member of the Adjunct academic Faculty at Queen's and lately Director of Ministry for the Diocese read a letter of congratulation from Dr Joanne Mercer. In it she said that the founders of Queen's would have been amazed to know that graduates of the College were being admitted four thousand miles away, but it was wonderful that despite that distance these new graduates were connected to Queen's in a special way. The Most Reverend Michael Lewis, bishop of the Diocese and Archbishop of the Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East, admitted the graduates, two of whom will continue to serve as Readers and two as Priests. The Archbishop expressed his delight at being present on this special occasion, and his appreciation of the tremendous hard work over six years that had led to the awards. The occasion was set in the context of a service of Evensong at which the Archbishop preached. He spoke of the importance of Wisdom, and of recognizing its source in Christ himself.
