3828-Q Initiation and Pastoral Offices

Welcome to the course on the Initiation and Pastoral Offices. According to Robert Taft "any theology of initiation that is not based on the concrete historical tradition of baptism is a delusion and a waste of time." **The Rites of Christian Initiation"** (Johnson). This course attempts to introduce students to that concrete history and theology of initiation. Initiation into the Christian faith life traditionally is a sacramental unitive process of water baptism, consignation or confirmation and Eucharist. It is a complex history and theology and without a keen awareness of the tradition, the four pastoral offices of reconciliation, anointing of the sick, matrimony and orders suffer considerably. The aim of this course is to deepen student's experience and awareness of the history, liturgy, theology, spirituality and pastoral liturgical practice of these rites in the public prayer of the Church, East and West. I will weave together biblical, ritual, historical and theological dimensions.
