### Biblical Studies 3071-Q: Perspectives on Human Suffering in the Old Testament (New Course)

*Course Description:* This course examines the problem of "suffering" in the Hebrew Bible. While suffering is a universal human phenomenon, the Hebrew Bible does not present easy answers, but rather provides numerous perspectives and approaches. In this course we will delve into a range of material from the canon including Psalms, Proverbs, Lamentations, Jeremiah as well as some material from the wider ancient Near Eastern milieu from which the Hebrew Biblical texts emerged. As a point of focus we will give considerable attention to the book of Job. Prerequisite: Biblical Studies 3000-Q.
